With a growing prevalence of diabetic foot ulcers in the Canadian population, health professionals are always looking for ways to promote timely, effective healing. In many cases, especially where the threat of amputation looms, time is of the essence in finding solutions that are also cost-effective and patient-friendly.

Integra Dermal Regeneration Template (IDRT) is a skin replacement matrix designed to provide immediate wound closure and permanent regeneration of the dermis. The product consists of a complex three-dimensional porous matrix that acts as a scaffold for cell migration and allows for regeneration of the dermal layer of the patient's skin. With a goal of a single application approach, IDRT is cost-effective and preferred by patients looking for fewer clinic visits and procedures.

A pivotal randomized controlled clinical trial, the FOot Ulcer New Dermal Replacement (FOUNDER) Study, enrolled 307 patients at 32 sites. Patients were monitored for up to 29 weeks. The primary endpoint of the study was the incidence of complete wound closure at 16 weeks, as assessed by the investigator. The secondary outcome measures included time to complete wound closure, rate of wound closure, incidence of recurrence and change in quality of life metrics.*
