DIRECT COSTS

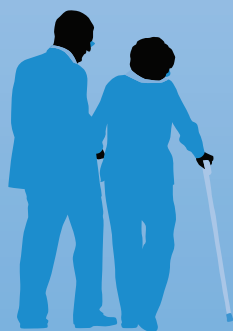


 **50% of nursing visits**³ involve wound care delivery in the community

 **35% of persons**⁴ receiving community care have a chronic wound

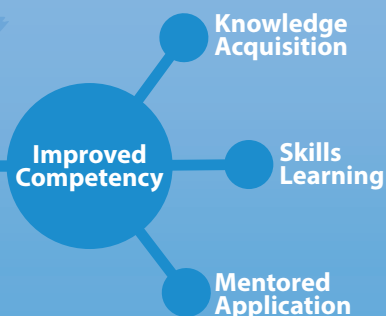
 **26% of persons**⁴ in an acute or non-acute setting have a pressure injury
