## Abstracts will be rejected for any of the following reasons:

- Brand, trade or commercial names are included in submission.
- No findings/results are identified in the submission.

### **General Criteria for Abstracts**

- **Title**: Create a title that concisely and accurately portrays the content of the abstract.
- Aim: Clearly state the purpose of the work.
- **Procedure/Method:** Describe the procedures/activities or methodology used to conduct your work. Please provide specific Information about subject characteristics or health-care setting where relevant.
- Findings/Results: Summarize key findings or important results that you wish to share with colleagues in a clear and concise manner. Where results warrant, provide reasonable conclusions that relate back to the study purpose/objectives.
- Implications/Applications: Clearly state how the outcomes and potential applications are pertinent to this audience.

### Scoring

Abstract Review Committee members will use each of the five specific criteria, using the scale below, to score each abstract:

- 0 = Criterion missing
- 1 = Criterion exists but is minimal and unacceptable
- 2 = Criterion is almost acceptable
- 3 = Acceptable adequate handling of the criterion
- 4 = Exceeds very good handling of the criterion
- 5 = Excellent handling of criterion

(for findings/results the score will be out of 10)

<b>Title:</b> The primary aspects of the project, including objectives, are clearly stated in a logical progression.	/5
<b>Aim:</b> The objective(s), are clearly stated in a logical progression. The topic is of importance and interest to the target audience.	/5
<b>Procedure/Method:</b> The materials and methods (what was done or details of the program) are clearly stated.	/5
<b>Findings/Results:</b> The usage or outcomes/findings are clearly stated and any conclusions or claims are warranted. Conclusions are appropriate given the results and limitations of study design and methodologies.	/10
<b>Implications/Applications:</b> The information in the abstract is current, innovative and supported by procedures carried out in the work.	/5
