

Dr. Vincent Maida is a consultant in Palliative Medicine & Wound Management at the William Osler Health System in Toronto. He was born in Toronto and graduated with his MD from the University of Toronto. He was promoted to Associate Professor at the University of Toronto in 2011 after the minimum 5 years from his junior promotion. He completed his MSc in Wound Management at the University of Toronto in 2010. In 2011, he completed his Medical Teachers Certificate, and in 2014, he completed his certificate in Patient Safety and Quality Improvement, both at the University of Toronto.

Dr. Maida is an internationally recognized expert in Cannabinoid Medicine with more than 2 decades of clinical experience. Dr. Maida is an active researcher with particular interests in pain and symptom management, wound management, prognosis, and medical education. Over the past 10 years he has published 6 medical textbook chapters, over 30 original research papers, created numerous original conceptual innovations, inventions, and patents in Palliative Medicine and Wound Management, as well as delivering over 100 national and international presentations on 5 continents, 17 countries, and over 50 cities. Over the past 10 years, his publications have been cited by other researchers and authors more than 800 times worldwide.

Dr. Maida was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II **Golden** Jubilee medal in 2002, and the Queen Elizabeth II **Diamond** Jubilee medal in 2012 for his work in Palliative Care and Wound Management, and overall contributions to Canadian society.
